


Notes on the guitar neck chart helper

This area indicates any open notes playable, an open note is a single string played without fretting.

The red dots indicate any fretted notes.

When two note qualities are shown (as in this example) it means they are enharmonic to each other (the same). It will depend on the key you are playing in as to which note to use.

G# A \flat



The large light grey numbering indicates fret numbers.



These represent string numbers. The 1st string is the skinniest and the 6th string is the fattest.

The light grey diamonds represent fret position markers. These are placed at standard positions however, some guitars may have more or less markers.

The notes represented as guitar Tablature.

The notes represented in musical notation. Note that only one key is shown.




















